## Raspberries bare root \$5 ea. Or \$20 bundle of 5

<i>Willamette</i>	Summer variety.
<i>Chilcotin</i>	Summer variety.
<i>Chilliwack</i>	Summer variety.
<i>Autumn Bliss</i>	Autumn crop.

## Apples in root trainer pots \$39.50 ea.

On M9, M26 and MM102 dwarfing rootstocks. See plant label for pollination compatibility.

## Pears in root trainer pots \$39.50 ea.

A wide selection, restricted numbers, non-dwarfing rootstock.

## Apricot \* bare root \$24.50 ea.

<i>Trevatt</i>	Prolific mid season apricot.
<i>Divinity</i>	Early fruiting small to medium, tender sweet fruit.
<i>Moorpark</i>	Mid to late fruiting popular variety. Large fruit.
<i>Tilton</i>	Firm, flavourful flesh, heavy cropper, resistant to late frosts, good for freezing, drying, and bottling.
<i>Hunter</i>	Large, late fruiting variety with dark orange flesh.
<i>Plumcot</i>	A plum/apricot cross resulting in a unique blend of flavours, Plumcots have a higher sugar content and a much sweeter flavor than plums or apricots.

## Peach \* bare root \$24.50 ea.

<i>Golden Queen</i>	Yellow fleshed clingstone. Late fruiting.
<i>Orion</i>	Very early ripening peach, small, white fleshed fruit, an extremely heavy cropper.
<i>Anzac</i>	Large, white fleshed freestone. Fruits early season.
<i>Bendigo Beauty</i>	Ripens early January, good crop of sweet, white, juicy flesh with red skin.
<i>Coronet</i>	Medium-sized fruit covered with a bright, attractive red blush over a yellow ground color. The flesh is yellow, firm but melting, smooth textured, and of good but mild flavour.
<i>Flavourcrest</i>	Large, firm with yellow flesh, mid season ripening.
<i>Elberta</i>	Old variety, still very popular, sweet, juicy flesh great eaten fresh or bottles and dries well.

## Persimmon bare root \$38.50 ea.

<i>Fuyu*</i>	Top Class, non-astringent variety. Prolific producer of superbly flavoured, non seeded fruit.
<i>Vanilla*</i>	A new variety, developed in Israel, also known as 'Sharon Fruit' can be eaten while still crisp.

## Mulberry bare root \$34.00 ea.

<i>Black English*</i>	A black mulberry variety that has prolific fruit over a short season.
<i>Hicks Fancy*</i>	Recommended for cool areas, ripe fruit is slightly red, fruiting for many months.

<i>Preston Prolific</i>	Yellow skin, white pulp.

**Pomegranate** bare root \$18.50 ea.

<i>Pomegranate*</i>	A fruit which has recently been re-discovered and popularised. Contains natural properties which may combat prostate cancer.

**Plum Japanese**<sup>1</sup> bare root \$24.50 ea.

<i>Santa Rosa</i>	Large, yellow fleshed plum. Popular, early fruiting variety.

<i>Mariposa</i>	Popular mid season blood plum.

<i>Satsuma</i>	Medium sized blood plum, mid season fruit. Santa Rosa is the preferred pollinator.

<i>Elephant Heart</i>	Late fruiting, massive heart shaped blood plum. Mariposa is the preferred pollinator.

<i>Wickson</i>	A large, heart-shaped, greenish yellow fruit that is firm and very sweet, very popular for fresh eating.

<i>Narrabeen</i>	Large, round fruit. Deep pink to deep red over a yellow-green ground, heavy bloom. Creamy-white, firm and juicy flesh with a sweet flavour.

**Plum European**<sup>2</sup> bare root \$24.50 ea.

<i>Angelina</i>	Black skin, yellow flesh, medium size. Fruits early to mid season.

<i>Prune D'Agen</i>	Purple prune.

<i>President</i>	Large, oblong shaped. Black skin and yellow flesh. Fruits late season.

**Cherry**<sup>3</sup> bare root \$24.50 ea.

<i>Sunburst*</i>	Large red cherry, mid season, self pollinating.

<i>Bing</i>	Dark red, large berries. Fruits mid season.

<i>Blackboy</i>	Dark red, large sweet berries. Fruits mid-late. Requires pollinator, Napoleon.

<i>Napolean (white)</i>	Light red and large fruit. Mid season fruiting. Pollinator, Black Boy.

<i>Stella*</i>	Enormous dark red fruit, maturing mid season. Self pollinating.

<i>English Morello*</i>	Small, red sour cherries, late fruiting. Self pollinating.

<i>Chellaston</i>	A soft shell variety.

1 Japanese Plums need another of the listed Japanese Plums for pollination.

2 European Plums need another of the listed European Plums for pollination.

3 Except for those marked as self fertile, Cherries need another of Cherry variety for successful pollination. Stella is helpful in pollinating most cherry varieties.

4 Almonds need another of the listed Almonds for pollination.

In general pollination compatibility is affected from season to season by variations in flowering time, climatic conditions and bee behaviour and numbers.
